


EPA announced the recipients of the first round of the <u>Clean School Bus Program</u>. Awarding nearly one billion dollars from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) of 2021. The grants will help school districts purchase over 2,400 electric school buses accelerating the transition to zero emission vehicles, producing cleaner air and energy security. We'd like to congratulate our two stakeholders, Rohrer Bus and Brightbill, for helping six school districts in our region to receive funding in Pennsylvania. We congratulate all <u>project winners</u> and are here to support their transition into electric school buses.



PennDOT & EP-ACT take NEVI Show on the Road

For many years, EPACT has been working hand-in-hand with Pittsburgh Region Clean Cities (PRCC) its counterpart on the western side of the state and our Department of Transportation. Over 5 years ago we began working to get PA roadways designated as alternative fuel corridors, to the Federal Administration (FHWA). Highway collective work have had all of PA's Interstates and a few tertiary roadways designated as alternative fuel corridor for electricity and natural gas, to the FHWA. This due diligence was instrumental in helping PA write its National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Plan.



NEVI includes over 1800 miles of Pennsylvania Interstates and roadways. The NEVI Plan was submitted to the <u>Joint office of Energy and Transportation</u> in late July and was approved in September. EP-ACT Stakeholder wins Driving PA Forward DC Charging Grant

In September the Pennsylvania DEP announced winners of The Driving PA Forward DC Fast Charging Grants program. They awarded \$3.4 million in Pennsylvania Volkswagen settlement funds to projects that will install 54 DC fast chargers in 16 hightraffic locations in 12 counties. The majority of the projects will help build out electric vehicle corridors across, Pennsylvania, where charging stations will be available every 50 miles, as part of the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Formula Program. The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation is heading up development of these corridors and other charging networks across the state.





EPACT partnered with stakeholder blink to get funding to install a DC Fast Charger at Kwikfil convenience store off I-80 in Harrisville PA. "Our partnership has been in place for over 10 years," stated Bill Policastro, blink's VP of Grants. "We worked together to help bring Pennsylvania it's 1st public electric charging station back when there weren't many EV's on the road. Working with EPACT (Then, Greater Philadelphia Clean Cities) has been a great team effort to educate and facilitate EV adoption throughout Pennsylvania."

The funding for this project was made possible from the <u>Driving PA</u>
<u>Forward Program</u>. Pennsylvania was allocated over \$118.5 million over 5 years in the State Trust Agreement.


